Urgent research problems and challenges

- → Provision of sign language interpreter services
- **→** Choice of professions
- → Low-skill occupations
- → Employers lack information on issues of deafness
- → Ways of seeking a job
- → Role of the State Employment Agency in seeking jobs for youths
- **→** Emigration
- → Psychological and communication barriers

Research studies


- 1) Acquiring information from the LAD database and from studies
- 2) A questionnaire survey 50 deaf youths (aged 15-30)
- 3) 3 partially structured interviews with the State Employment Agency (SEA), the Employers' Confederation of Latvia (LDDK) and a deaf youth;
- 4) An experiment looking for a job

Sign language interpreter services at professional and higher education institutions






Vai jūs zināt, kur var konsultēties par profesijas izvēli? / Do you know where you can get advice on the choice of a profession?












Vai darba meklējumos jums nepieciešams konsultants jeb darba asistents? / Do you need a consultant or employment assistant when looking for a job?





Partially structured interviews

An interview with a SEA expert: conclusions

- a)The SEA provides sign language services the services are little used
- b) Lack of information on SEA services
- c) Government-subsidised jobs the most demanded SEA activity
- d)"Youth guarantees" activities partially limited opportunities for deaf youths

Partially structured interviews

An interview with LDDK: conclusions

- a) No information about the situation in deaf youth employment
- b) They believe that youths have to learn, acquire professions as well as communication skills
- Information activities for employers have to be organised
- d) The government has to provide deaf persons with hearing-loss compensation means
- e) Amendments are needed in legal acts

Partially structured interviews

An interview with a youth called Mark: conclusions

- a) The profession chosen: multimedia design
- b) Job search opportunities
- c) Job search at the SEA no result
- d)Improvement of professional knowledge and skills

The process from the choice of a profession to a youth's integration into the labour market is not professionally organised!

Experiment

A CV with a motivation letter sent to 30 enterprises by e-mail:

- a) Sent in two parts:
 - 1) applications for any job 15
 - 2) applications for a job in a certain profession data entry operator 15
- b) No result

Such a way of looking for a job is not the most effective!

Necessary activities:

- "Youth guarantees" activity has to be more available to deaf youths;
- An information campaign targeting employers concerning issues of deafness;
- ×A cooperation and coordination network among the LAD, LDDK and the SEA;
- *Adapted information is necessary

Proposals

A support centre has to be established based on the LAD

Basic functions of the support centre have to involve:

- → identification of professional orientation,
- → provision of information,
- → help and support in seeking a job.
