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# 1.What?

Deaf and hearing youth from 8 different countries: The Netherlands, Latvia, Lithuania, Bulgaria, Hungary, Poland, Greece, Czech Republic will come together this summer in Ommen, The Netherlands.

During "Do you see it work?" deaf and hearing participants will meet, learn, work, explore, express and create together. The topic of the exchange is work. We focus on the fact that deaf and hearing youth learn from each other and each other's differences in culture, habits, ways to communicate, ideas and experiences with work.

We will have an active programme with both indoor and outdoor activities. We will work with different media, our **body** and our **senses**.

In many parts of the exchange interpreters will be used in order to translate from spoken English to International Sign Language and vice versa.

# 2. When?

# 2.1 Dates of the exchange

Arrival day: 21<sup>st</sup> July 2012 from 12:00 o'clock

Start of the program: 22<sup>nd</sup> July 2012 from 14:00 o'clock

End of program: 2<sup>nd</sup> August 2012 at 23:00 o'clock

Departure day: 3<sup>rd</sup> August 2012 before 12:00 o'clock

#### 2.2 Arrivals-Departures

- When you receive the confirmation letter, check with the contact person of your sending organization before booking your ticket. In that way, you can organize together your arrival and departure time.
- We expect you to be there the whole time of the project, otherwise we cannot reimburse your travel expenses.
- If you plan to arrive earlier or leave later, let us know so that we will be able to support you.

# 5. Money Reimbursement

#### 5.1 Reimbursement of travel cost
